### Dear Heronfield Families,

One of my favorite moments each week actually occurs twice each week. On Tuesday mornings, we gather for our Community Meeting, and Wednesdays bring Sanctuary. While both occur through Zoom these days, it is wonderful to see our whole student body and faculty all together as we tell and hear stories, celebrate one another, and learn a little bit more about the world that we all live in.

Community Meetings are a bit lighter, by design, providing time to talk about campus events, to tell of our life experiences, and to connect over topics of shared interest. Most teachers have presented at a Community Meeting this year, with topics ranging from Ms. Berton guiding her dog through an illness to Ms. Slavitz' experience with Teach for America. On occasion, a faculty member will suggest a relative or friend whose story might be meaningful: Kirsten Johnson's brother Erik joined us from Minnesota, where he is a cartoonist and graphic designer, and just this morning we welcomed Kari Schmitz' brother Casey, a fashion designer based in Paris, who talked of the challenges of his teenage years and his work as the creative director of a fashion house that leads with kindness and empathy.

Our Wednesday Sanctuary sessions have a different flavor and rhythm. Rob Thomas begins by playing a song that often captures the mood of the moment, and Ron King leads us all in greeting one another and in reciting the school prayer. Sanctuary speakers come from our own faculty, our Board of Trustees, and the wider community, and each one encourages us to consider new perspectives and ideas. We have welcomed leaders and speakers from a number of different religions, realizing how each differs in its practices and yet how they all center on key values of respect, kindness, and compassion. Our faculty speakers share from their own experiences, often weaving a reading with their own history to help us consider a greater lesson. Tomorrow we will be joined by Flo Magdalena, grandmother of one of our seventh grade students; she will share her work as a spiritual healer and help us explore the connection of mind, body, and spirit.

In the coming weeks, we will begin letting you know of upcoming speakers for Community and Sanctuary meetings, and I hope that you will ask your children about these sessions and the messages they take away from them. I hope I can seek your understanding in a related topic: from time to time, some parents have asked to join these sessions via Zoom, and we hope that these gatherings that begin our school day might remain a time for our students and teachers, a space for young people to consider how what they hear relates to what they believe and feel is important in the world. We equally, hope, though, that these sessions will encourage interesting and thoughtful conversations at home.

We close each Sanctuary with the call 'Let us go forth' and the united response 'To let our light shine!' These meetings are indeed among the many shining lights at Heronfield.
