Dear Heronfield Families,

I sat down to write last week with two topics in mind before writing a lighter piece about the start of spring and the many ways that we are coming out of our hibernation, so to speak, as a school community. I'm excited for the weeks ahead, and I encourage you to take notice of the many announcements in this newsletter – further evidence of a vibrant spring to come.

To be honest, the other topic of last week is a bit more challenging and yet it, too, needs a bit of exploration. Last week, we had just learned of the events in my home state of Colorado, in a town and at a grocery store chain that are both very familiar from my childhood. And the events in Boulder followed another awful tragedy in Atlanta, one made all the more difficult by the clear racial elements and the recognition of the rising hostility toward Asian–Americans in our country over the last year. As I write, I add my voice to the many that have spoken out against this hate. I join others in expressing sadness for the ways that we as human beings consistently see those we don't know as categories, labels, and targets of blame for whatever might challenge us as individuals and as a society. I think of friends, of students and colleagues at three schools. I wonder what they have been going through and how to be part of the solution.

When times like these come into our consciousness, it's possible to be saddened and remain so. But the human spirit is remarkably strong, and it has been equally important to see the memorial built by strangers at the King Soopers in Boulder, and to see the outpouring of solidarity for Asian-Americans and Pacific Islanders, to see so many step forward and share resources and spread compassion and just take the time to know someone's name and hear her story.

Times like these are undoubtedly hard, but times like these also provide reminders to hold people close and value a community such as ours. The emerging spring offers clear evidence that things change on a school campus, and as a school we will continue to consider how we can keep moving forward and helping our students grow. At the same time, we will always build on the foundation of our values, the shared commitment to find unity in our differences, to celebrate every individual for who they are, and to lead with respect and kindness in all that we do. We cannot change what happens, but we can learn from it and grow from it. We can honor those lost by bringing light to the world in our own ways and by teaching our young people all we can so that they will join us in creating a better world.

There is indeed much to reflect upon, but also so much to be grateful for. As we look ahead to a warming spring here at Heronfield, let's build on the opportunities that we have already shared this year and allow the joy, laughter, and sunshine to fill our souls at a time when we really need it.
